

What has school done to support your learning?

- School has provided a reduced timetable showing how much work you will be expected to complete each week
- You will be able to ask questions via the messenger facility in Show My Homework or by an email contact which may be given to you by your teacher
- Teachers have been asked to respond to questions about specific pieces of work within 24 hours – where possible

- School has produced a remote learning timetable for Year 7 to 11
- Years 12 and 13 should continue to follow their normal timetable where possible
- Timings have been adapted to ensure the expectations remain realistic
- PE has been included in KS3 – the PE department will post links to indoor activities and healthy lifestyles as it is important to keep active as much as possible
- The timetable will be reviewed every 2 weeks to see if subject time needs to be increased
- The timetable can be accessed via the school website

What does school expect from you?

- You should try to complete work for each lesson within the given timeslot.
- If this is not possible the work should be completed before the next time slot given for that subject.
- You should set out your work as you would at school, there should be the date, title, CW and all should be underlined.
- Your class teachers will ask you to upload work to Show my Homework or submit via email if possible – not all work will need to be uploaded – some evidence may be asked for as a photograph or scanned image.
- You should self-mark using a green pen as you would in school.
- You should store all work appropriately – paper based work should be stored in a folder or plastic wallet, electronic work should be saved in organised folders in an appropriate location.

What will the work look like?

- Work will be set using Show My Homework
- Tasks will be linked to the work you have been doing in class
- You can expect to be asked to complete a mix of tasks – some online, some worksheets and some tasks will need to be completed in books.
- You will be provided with clear guidance and instructions on how to complete the tasks given for each week.
- You can expect work to be set for the lesson times on the new remote learning timetable – dates for setting and submitting work are likely to be the same day.

What might a lesson look like?

- Each lesson that is placed on Show My Homework will have the year group, week number and lesson number clearly shown – this means you will be able to follow how lessons links together.
- Lessons may contain a range of tasks – each one will be guided with instructions and any support material needed.
- You may be asked to read through PowerPoint slides or watch video clips that introduce new topics
- You may be asked to make notes on these which can be checked later
- You may be asked to produce knowledge organisers or learning mats
- You may be given example exam questions or asked to compile a set of questions that could be shared with others in your class based on the topic being covered.

What feedback will you get?

- Your teachers will set some work that will be submitted online and will be checked
- You will be asked to complete some improvement phase questions at certain points
- Your work will be monitored and checked where possible
