	4	Foreign relations e.g. EEC, EFTA, Nuclear deterrent, Korean War, decolonisation, Suez
1964-70	5	Wilson and Labour e.g. ideology, devaluation, Trade Unions, Labour divisions, Ireland, 1970 election
	6	Liberalising legislation e.g. capital punishment, divorce, abortion, homosexual relations, education
